WORLD WAR II MEMORIAL

On May 29, 2004 the National World War II Memorial, located on the Mall in Washington, D.C., was dedicated. It honors all military veterans of the war, the citizens on the home front, the nation at large, and the high moral purpose and idealism that motivated the nation's call to arms.

World War II Registry

You can honor members of the World War II generation by enrolling them in the World War II Registry of Remembrances, a list of individual Americans who participated in the war effort. Access to the registry is available from the main page of the National World War II memorial home page <http://w.wwiimemorial.com> The Registry of Remembrances is open to any US citizen who helped in the war effort, whether a veteran or a home front volunteer. From the registry page you can enroll an individual by selecting "Register an Honoree."

The Registry of Remembrances includes four databases:

- 1) Buried in American Battle Monuments Commission (ABMC) overseas military cemeteries.
- 2) Memorialized on ABMC Tablets of the Missing.
- 3) Listed on official War and Navy Department Killed in Service rosters now held by the National Archives and Records Administration
- 4) Honored by public enrollment in the Registry of Remembrances.

Nationwide Gravesite Locator

Another website that will help located soldiers from all wars is the Nationwide Grave Locator http://gravelocator.cem.va.gov/j2ee/servlet/NGL_v1 which allows you to search all of the country's National Cemeteries. Most of the 120 Department of Veterans Affairs' national cemeteries (including Wilmington) can be searched. The site tells you the few that are still being added to the database. The site is also has interesting information on who qualifies for National Cemetery burial, where to get headstones and markers (even for Confederates), military funeral honors, where to obtain military records and medals and a history of the program. Wonderful site maps accompany the individual cemetery information.

Oral Histories

Another project that various historical organizations are encouraging are the taping of oral histories of veterans and those who were active on the home front during the war. Over 1200 citizens of that era are dying every day and their memories will be lost if we do not make a determined effort to preserve these priceless recollections. If you have family members who lived through World War II, take some time to interview them about their lives. It will be invaluable for future generations of your family.

November Term 1816

At a Court of Pleas & Quarter Sessions began and held in the county of New Hanover at the Court House in Wilmington on the 2nd Monday of November being the 11th day of November in the 41st year of independence AD 1816

The court opened with the usual proclamations

Jeremiah **Nichols** and Jeremiah **Hand**, two of the venire, excused on not being freeholders

John **Lamb**, one of the venire, discharged on oath of sickness of family

Administration on the estate of Thomas **Grandy** granted to Thomas **Callender** giving bond in \$400 with David **Smith** and James **Dickson** as securities

Administration on the estate of Samuel Blanks granted to **Richard** Lloyd giving bond in \$10,000 with John McCull and David Lloyd as securities. Bond executed and filed. Admr qualified.

Court adjourned till 10 o'clock tomorrow

Court met according to adjournment

Present the **Worshpful**: Joseph Lamb, William Jones **Larkins**, Wm H. Vann, Samuel Buxton

On motion of John D. Toomer, Esq., Anthony Meilan, Esq. admitted to practice as an attorney, he having exhibited his license and having taken the oath as required by law.

Ordered that Arabella Corbet be appointed guardian of William, Anna, Molsey, James, and Arabella Corbet on giving bond in \$5000 for each ward with Aaron **Larkins**, William Keith, John **Larkins**, and Reuben Newton as securities. Bonds executed and filed

Ordered that A. M. Hooper and Gabriel Holmes, Jr. be appointed to audit the accounts of Owen **Kenan** as late county trustee and ascertain the amount due the county from him for the year for which **Hinton** James and James Foy were his securities and report to next court

Ordered that the appointments of Gideon Arthur as constable of **Wilmington** District and of Neal Wall as constable of Rocky Point District be rescinded as they not having given bonds according to law and that a copy of this order be set up at Washington and in Rocky Point at Spiro Stanley's.

Ordered that letters ad collegium on the estate of John Sellers be granted to Angus Sellers and Charles **McAllister** giving bond and security in the sum of ten thousand dollars with Col. Richard Parish and Neill **McLaurin** as securities. Bond executed and filed.

Excrs of John Sellers vs John G. Morris, Robert Henry, Caty Sellers, and Jane Sellers - Devisant bell non - Jury empanelled, viz: S. Herring, Sr., John J. James, William Moore, W. Bordeaux, **Richard** Miller, Nathaniel Harriss, B. **Wooten**, T. C. **Reston**, James Usher, John Walker, Major Clark, Richard Saunders and find for the defts - Appeal prayed and granted giving Richard Parish and Neill **McLaurin** as securities.

J. W. Walker vs Wm M. Fisher - Original attachment - Default - same jury and assess damages 5 cents and costs.

Ordered that Robert **Rankin** be appointed Inspector of sawed lumber, staves, heading, shingles, and timber giving bond according to Act of Assembly with Jacob **Hartman** and Henry Taylor as securities

Joseph Lamb to the use of admr of A. Golden vs Joel Henry and James Ball - case general issue - payment- set off. Same jury and find that debt did assume, that there is no payment or set off and assess damages at \$199 with interest from 1st July 1812 and costs

William **McCurdy** vs Hannah Anderson - not guilty - same jury except Nathaniel Harriss in whose room is Alexander Peden and find the debt guilty in manner and form as alleged in plff s declaration and assess damages at \$62 and costs. Judgment assigned to John **Cowan**

Ordered that Dr. **Judah** have permission to erect under the southeast corner of the Court House a room 12 ft. square for the purpose of keeping his soda water establishment and selling soda water with the condition that he repair the pavement under the Court House and keep the same in repair and also keep the windows of the Court House in repair after they are repaired at the public expense.

Court adjourned to 3 o'clock in the afternoon

Ordered that Duncan Robinson, Charles Murphy, and John Corbet, Sr. be appointed to divide the personal estate of Archibald Sellers, deceased.

Lewis **Paget** vs Don Francisco **Caol---**, Captain of Spanish Barque. Case general issue, payment, set off - Jury empanelled, viz: Samuel Herring, Sr., John J. James, William Moore, William Bordeaux, Richard Miller, Nathaniel Harriss, Alexander Peden, Bryan **Wooten**, John Walker, Major Clark, Richard Saunders, John G. Morris and find that deft did not assume. Appeal prayed and granted in giving bond with James H. Draughon and Israel Judge as securities

John Lord vs Same - case general issue - same jury and find that deft's intestate did assume and assess damages at \$400 with interest from 1st Aug 1815 and costs

Bank of Cape Fear vs Joseph Jacobs - Debt on record - Court adjudged that there is such a record and give judgment for \$94.39 and \$22.64 interest, with interest on the sum of \$94.39 from 13th November 1816 to be paid and costs. Jury charged and find that there have been no payments.

Admr Wm S. **Hasell** vs Daniel McClammy - general issue - same jury empanelled except Daniel McClammy in whose room is John G. Morris and find that deft did assume and assess damages at \$24 with interest from 12th August 1814 and costs.

Ordered that Susan Wright be appointed guardian of Thomas, Lucy, John, William, Joshua, and Caroline Wright to attend to their interests in the division of the estate between the said children and Charles J. Wright and A. **Empie** and wife

Thomas **Cowan** and Robert Middleton appointed admrs of the estate of John E. Spicer, deceased, giving bond in \$20,000 with Gilbert Geer, Jacob **Hartman**, **Hinton** James, and James Bland as securities. Bond executed and filed.

John **McCull**, John **Cowan**, Gabriel Holmes, and Wm B. **Meares** appointed to lay off and allot to the widow of John E. Spicer a year's provisions

Ordered that **Burwell** Pearce about 17 years old be bound to Isaac Hines until he is twenty one years old, on said Isaac Hines giving bond in two hundred pounds with Samuel James and Joshua James as securities

Ordered that Jane Miller be appointed guardian to Charles **Gause** and Thomas Jefferson Miller, children of John Miller, deceased to attend to their interests in a petition filed by Richard Miller for division of land

Court adioumed to 3 o'clock afternoon

James Usher vs Michael Boney - case general issue - payment, set off. Jury empanelled, viz: S. Herring, Sr., Caleb Nichols, John G. Morris, D. McKay, James Mason, John Walker, William Woodcock, Daniel McClammy, Joseph **Kellogg**, Murdoch McKay, Julius Walker, Miles Blake and find that deft did assume, that there is no payment nor set off and assess damages at \$129 with interest from 25th December 1815 and costs

William Hall vs James Usher - Ruled for trial and non-suited. Appeal prayed and granted on giving John **Cowan** and Gabriel Holmes, Jr. securities

Grand jury discharged

Account of John Gibbs, guardian, with his wards Hy and William Fitzgerald rendered to court and ordered to be filed.

Jacob **Hartman** defaulting talisman fine remitted

State vs William McCurdy - Nancy Watson prosecutor. Submission - fined \$15 and costs. Fine and costs paid.

Same vs Same - Rhoda Potter prosecutor - Submission - fined \$15 and costs. Fine and costs paid. Amount of fines and costs in both cases \$47.60

Same vs William McCurdy, John **Cowan**, and Joshua James - Scifi on judgment nisi on forfeiture recognizance

Same vs William Woodcock, Benjamin Moore, & Benjamin Motte. Forfeiture remitted on condition of costs being paid. Costs \$5.59. Paid into office.

Same vs Philip Bazadier. Assault and battery. Pleads not guilty. Jury empanelled, viz: S. Herring, Sr., A. Bordeaux, J. J. James, T. C. **Reston**, William Harriss, T. J. Davis, Caleb Nichols, Alexander Peden, Nathaniel Harriss, John Walker, Charles P. Moore, Arthur Walker and find deft guilty in manner and form as charged in the bill of indictment. Fined \$4 and costs.

State vs Jacob Winthrop - Petty larceny. Pleads not guilty - Same jury and find the deft guilty in manner and form as charged in the bill of indictment. Judgment of the Court that he receive 39 lashes on his bare back.

Peter Cotton vs **Admr W. S. Hasell** - general issue. Fully administered. Same jury and find that deft's intestate did assume and assess plff's damages at \$163.66 principal and \$4.08 interest with interest on the principal from the 15th November 1816 until paid and further find that the deft has fully administered all the assets that have already come to hand. Judgment payable when assets do come to hand.

Talcot Burr vs Lane - general issue - fully administered. Same jury and find that the deft's intestate did assume and assess damages at \$68.09 principal and \$4.08 interest from 15th November 1816 till paid on principal and costs and further find that the deft has fully administered. On motion ordered that **scifi** issue to the heirs, it being represented that the said heirs reside out of the state. It is further ordered that the publication be made according to law.

Same vs Same - same plea - same jury and find that deft's intestate did assume and assess damages at \$190 principal and \$4.08 interest with interest on the principal from 15th Nov 1816 till paid and costs and further find that deft has fully administered. Same order for publication as in foregoing suit.

Eli **Brocket** vs **admr Samuel Sexton** - general issue, fully administered. Same jury and find that deft's intestate did assume and assess damages at \$1039 with interest from 8th June 1816 till paid and costs and further find that deft has fully administered. BOOK CORNER

NEW! The long awaited volume of *New Hanover County, North Carolina Minutes of the Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions, 1801-1804* has finally been completed. It was done by transcription master, John Wright Butler, and ably typed and indexed by Ann Hewlett Hutteman, with an introduction by Beverly Tetterton. It fills in a glaring gap in the publication of the county's court minutes. As every one knows, these minutes contain a wealth of information for the genealogist. It may be the only clue to the death date of a decedent who died intestate because the court makes note of administrator and administratrix appointments for estates. It places ancestors in a specific county at a specific time as when a free holder served on a jury. The list is simply endless. The cost is \$29.00 plus shipping and handling.

As announced in the last *Clarendon Courier*, *Greenlawn Memorial Cemetery, Wilmington, NC, Volume One - Four*, compiled by J. Kenneth Davis, Jr. and *Wills in Deed Book A, Brunswick County, NC 1764-1772*, transcribed by Joseph Sheppard, are also available for purchase. These books would be a valuable addition to the library of any folks doing research in the Lower Cape Fear area. All four volumes of the *Greenlawn* series are \$99.00; Volume I, A to G is \$29.00; Volume II, H to O is \$27.00; Volume II, P to Z is \$27.00 and Volume IV, the Supplemental Index is \$24.00. The Brunswick County Wills book is \$9.00.
