#### THE YOPP FUNERAL HOME REGISTER

In November 2004, Gene Todd gave the North Carolina Room of the New Hanover Public Library the records of the Yopp Funeral Home, which operated in Wilmington from 1892 until 1966, under the direction of father and son, Walter Edward Yopp, Sr. and Jr. The firm was first located at 206 Princess Street. They were for a time at 211 Princess Street before moving in 1937 to a new building at 1207 Market Street. After the younger Yopp's death in 1968, the business was sold to Pender Burke and continued operating for a time as Burke-Yopp Funeral Home until it closed in the early 1970s.

The early Yopp ledgers from 1892 through 1911 are primarily financial records. They usually show the name of the person responsible for the payment of services, the date of the services and often the cemetery. In some instances, there is more information. These records are not indexed.

The ledgers from 1912 - 1938 contain more complete records, with the decadent being named and date of services rendered. There are approximately 1500 names from the records of this period which have been indexed, annotated and arranged alphabetically by J. Kenneth Davis, using the original record books and other sources. Generally, this contains the name, birth and death dates, next of kin and the burial place. This index is available in the North Carolina Room of the New Hanover Public Library.

The records from 1938 - 1966 are filed in chronological order. This register file contains some 4000 "shucks" numbered from 1 to 4019, and are in date order when the fbneral service occurred. (There are some shucks that are dated after 1966, the last being in 1973.) The bulk of the shucks are from 2 February 1938 until December 31, 1966. **Please note that the records of 5 March 1943 through 4 March 1945 are missing from the collection.** 

These cards are seldom filled out in their entirety, but do generally have the place and date of death, names of the parents of the deceased, survivors, pallbearers and the church and fbneral information. In addition, there maybe other information including correspondence with the family of the deceased, obituary, medical records, etc.- even the details of the clothing purchased for the deceased. This collection of shucks has been cleaned and organized by J. Kenneth Davis. An alphabetical index has been prepared by Ann Hewlett Hutteman, which can be used in the North Carolina Room.

The Courier editor recently found a person "missing" from her family tree for years by looking up the shuck on his fbneral. The long, lost relative died in Tacoma, Maryland and did not have a death certificate in New Hanover County, nor a stone in the Winter Park Cemetery. She even found that her father was a pallbearer at the services.

All Lower Cape Fear Researchers should be indebted to Gene Todd, J. Kenneth Davis, Peter Ambler and **Ann** Hewlett Hutteman for making this collection available for research.

Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions February Term, 1817

[This series of New Hanover County Court Minutes submitted by Helen Sammons is continued from the Fall, 2004, Courier. These records may be viewed on microfilm in the North Carolina Room of the New Hanover County Public Library.]

#### Thursday morning 13" February 1817

Court met according to adjournment

Present the Worshipful: John Hogg, Samuel Ashe, John McColl

John Wingate and William C. Lord fine \$2

State vs William Woodcock - Assault & Battery. Jury empanelled, viz: Ezekiel Register, John Bordeaux, Richard M. Bordeaux, G. W. Murray, Bat **Batson**, William Harriss, John Pridgen, Daniel **McKay**, Owen **Fillyaw**, Jere Nichols, Seth Hoard, Ezekiel Lane and find the deft guilty in manner and form as charged in indictment. Deft fined \$4. Fine and costs paid.

State vs James Green - Assault & Battery (not guilty) Same jury and find the deft guilty in manner and form as charged in the indictment. Fine \$4 - fine and costs paid, to wit: \$7.37

State vs Elizabeth Green - Assault & battery (not guilty) same jury and find the deft guilty in manner and form as charged in the indictment. Fined \$2 - costs paid, to wit: \$7.37

State vs James **Robeson** - Assault & Battery, etc. (not guilty) - same jury except Ezekiel Lane in whose room is James Marshal and find the deft guilty of an assault with intent to ravish Ann **Costin** as charged in manner and form with first count of the indictment. Judgment of the court that 39 lashes be inflicted on the prisoner immediately on the adjournment of the court and to be recommitted to gaol, there to remain for three calendar months and until all costs are paid

State vs Jesse Martin - Assault & Battery - Not guilty

State Bank vs Admr of J. E. Spicer - general issue - same jury and find that deft's intestate did assume and assess damages at \$100 with interest from 15" October 1816 and costs

State vs Charles R. Moore - case general issue - same jury and find that deft did assume and assess damages at \$900 with interest from 10" October 1816 and costs

Same vs Seth Hoard - case general issue - same jury except for Seth Hoard in whose place is James Mason and find that deft did assume and assess damages at \$759.28 with interest from 20" August 1816 and costs

Same vs Talcott Burr - general issue - same jury and find that deft did assume and assess damages at \$759.28 with interest from 20" August 1815 and costs

Same vs Robert **Rankin** - case general issue- same jury and find that deft did assume and assess damages at \$80 with interest from 20" October 1816 and costs

Same vs Same - case general issue - same jury and find that deft did assume and assess damages at \$55 with interest from 23<sup>rd</sup> Oct 1816 and costs

Same vs Same - Case general issue - same jury and find that deft did assume and assess damages at \$162 with interest from 14" October 1816 and costs

Same vs Same - Case general issue - same jury and find that deft did assume and assess damages at \$395 with interest from 4" October 1816 and costs

John M. Dobbin qualified as admr of John C. B-----

Edward St. George and William **Larkins** exhibited their commissions as Justice of the Peace and were duly qualified and took their seats

The will of James Henry was exhibited to court and proved by Robert Henry and William Henry, two of the subscribing witnesses thereto

The will of James Howard was exhibited to court and proved by Bat **Batson** subscribing witness thereto

The will of John Darden was exhibited to court and proved by N. Parker, one of the subscribing witnesses thereto; all ordered to be recorded Court adjourned to 3 o'clock in the afternoon

Court met according to adjournment

Murray, Bat **Batson**, William Harriss, John Pridgen, Daniel **McKay**, Owen **Fillyaw**, Jere Nichols, Seth Hoard, James Marshal and find that the deft did assume and assess damages at \$145 with interest from 14" October 1816 and costs

Same vs Same - case general issue - same jury and find that deft did assume and assess damages at \$133 with interest from  $23^{rd}$  September 1816 and costs

Same vs Admr of John E. Spicer - case general issue - same jury and find that deft's intestate did assume and assess damages at \$900 with interest from 14 December 1816 and costs

Same vs James W. Walker - case, payment - same jury and find that deft did assume, that there is no payment and assess damages at \$486 with interest from 13" July 1816 and costs

John Hogg, Chairman of the Court vs Hinton James and James Foy - payment, set off-same jury and find that defts do owe the sum of \$3200 to be discharged on the payment of \$515.62 with interest from this date and further find that said bond has not been paid or discharged

James S. Green and John A. Lillington vs E. D. Morrison - petition - It is ordered and decreed in this case on the hearing of the petition that E. D. Morrison be removed from the guardianship of Samuel **McRee** and that the petitioners be discharged and remain exempt from all liability as the securities of the said E. D. Morrison for the guardianship of the said Samuel for all acts or omissions of the said E. D. Morrison done or committed after this day Court adjourned to Saturday morning 10 o'clock

Ward as securities Orders rendered at February Term:

Ordered that administration on the estate of John C. Beach be granted to John M. Dobbin giving bond in \$3000 with Robert W. Brown and Robert Murphy as securities

Present: John McColl, William Hall, J. Henry, J. Hogg, Joel Parish, S. Buxton

Ordered that Samuel Batts be appointed guardian of John Batts giving bond in \$1000 with Samuel Lane, Bat **Batson** and Charles **Nixon** as securities

Ordered that the county Trustee be instructed to repair the windows of the Court House with netting or otherwise as he may deem expedient and that he defray the expenses accordingly out of the county funds

Ordered and decreed that James F. McRee have permission to emancipate a mulatto slave called Tom Burke on J. F. McRee and Nathaniel Hill entering bond agreeable to law

Ordered that administration on the estate of John J. Evans be granted to David Evans giving bond in 500 lbs. with Stokely Sidbury, Enoch Simmons, and Major Samuel **Ashe** as securities

Ordered that notice issue and be served on Esther Hays, a mulatto woman on Riley's Creek that she appear at the next term of this court with her children, Molly, John; Claussen, and Peggy in order to their being bound out by the court as the law on such cases prescribes

Ordered that Joseph Lamb, William Smith, and Richard Saunders be appointed to audit and settle the accounts of Timothy **Pigford** as guardian of the heirs of Joseph **Eakins** 

Ordered that Stokely Sidbury be appointed guardian of John Batts, giving bond in \$1000 with James **Nixon** and Charles **Nixon** as securities - Present J. Hogg, Joel Parish and John Henry

Ordered that George C. Clitherall be appointed guardian of Eliza Ingles Clitherall and Harriet Smith Clitherall, giving bond in each case for \$400 with John R. London and William C. Lord as securities. Present J. Hogg, Joseph Lamb, John **McColl**, Major Samuel **Ashe** 

Ordered that John G. Morris be appointed constable for lower Black River giving bond with David Jones and William Moore as securities

William Love, Inspector, came into court and prays to renew his bond for the performance of the duties of his office with Richard Lloyd and William **McKay** as his securities who are approved by the court

Ordered that an allowance be made to Charles B. Morris, jailor, of this county for the jail fees for keeping Allen Ramsey as per bill shown to and approved by the court amounting to twenty five dollars and eighty cents, giving credit for any part thereof that he may receive or on account of the said Allen Ramsey

Ordered that S\_\_\_\_ Gregory about twelve years of age be bound to Mrs. Susan Wright to learn the art and mystery of housekeeping and sewing, etc., giving bond with Charles Wright as security

Ordered that the commissioners for building a jail of and for this court be and and they are hereby authorized and directed to pay W. Hall, the contractor, what balance may be due him out of and from such monies arising out of the last monies levied and collected for this purpose and if the sum is insufficient to pay such balance that they be and hereby authorized to call on and receive from the county Trustee of this county such sums as may be necessary to pay and satisfy the balance remaining due

Ordered that **Griffith** J. McRee be appointed guardian of Samuel McRee giving James M. Henderson and James F. McRee as securities in the sum of \$2000. Present John Hogg, Edward St George, John Garnier, Joel Parish and Robert Henry

It appearing to the satisfaction of the court that the estate of the late John E. Spicer, deceased, is so far indebted that the debts cannot be discharged by the monies on hand at the death of the intestate and his admr having applied for an order to sell the personal estate of said intestate including twenty negroes. It is hereby ordered that he be authorized to sell the same or so much thereof as may be sufficient to pay said debts agreeably to the Acts of the General Assembly in such cases made and provided.

### RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE NATIONAL GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

#### Standards for Sound Genealogical Research

Copywrite, 1997 by the National Genealogical Society. Permission granted to copy or publish this material provided it is reproduced in its entirety, including this notice.

Remembering always that they are engaged in a quest for truth, family history researchers consistently:

- record the source for each item of information they collect.
- test every hypothesis or theory against credible evidence, and reject those that are not supported by the evidence.
- seek original records, or reproduced images of them when there is reasonable assurance they have not been altered, as the basis for their research conclusions.
- use compilations, communications and published works, whether paper or electronic, primarily for their value as guides to locating the original records.
- state something as a fact only when it is supported by convincing evidence, and identify the evidence when communicating with others.
- limit with words like "probable" or "possible" any statement that is based on less than convincing evidence, and state the reasons for concluding that it is probable or possible.
- avoid misleading other researchers by either intentionally or carelessly distributing or publishing inaccurate information.
- state **carefully** and honestly the results of their own research, and acknowledge all use of other researchers' work.
- recognize the collegial nature of genealogical research by making their work available to others through publication, or by placing copies in appropriate libraries or repositories, and by welcoming critical comment.
- consider with open minds new evidence or the comments of others on their work and the conclusions they have reached.
